Pray for Myanmar! — Kent Odor

In case you have not yet heard, Myanmar has undergone a Military Coup!

February 27: From Chuck, an ACS Board Member....

Just another small FYI... everything is not bad news. God is still doing miracles.

This morning I had a one-on-one call with one of the youth ministers in Myitkyina who is helping with translation work for our (upcoming) 12 step programs. He told me they had conducted a memorial service in the park for another youth who was killed by the police. Kachin as you know is the "Bible Belt" of Myanmar, and so the service was conducted as a Christian funeral. During the service he told me they formed a circle to hold hands – he had a Buddhist on one side and a Muslim on the other – while they all sang Amazing Grace. After the service was over, he said many of the Bamar and Muslim youth **were asking questions about the difference between reincarnation and resurrection....**

Back on February 7: We received a message from Yangon: "Myanmar has gone dark."

The message continued.... "Just 6 days after the Myanmar military seized control of the country in a coup detaining the country's leader Aung San Suu Kyi and the democratically elected leaders 'while making up charges to hold them,' Myanmar has now gone dark. First, the military stopped the use of Facebook where Myanmar civilians have been sharing news and Civil Disobedience Campaigns. Now, the military has

completely shut down the internet, cutting off the country from the rest of the world.

I cannot contact my parents, relatives and friends. My friends have not been able to contact their families either. Civil disobedience campaigns have spread across the country, with health professionals being at the forefront of it. Myanmar civilians are fighting peacefully for the end to military dictatorship once and for all. We are all fighting peacefully for democracy. The pans and pots bearing campaign is still going on every night at 8 pm to show rejection to the coup. In Myanmar tradition, pots and pans are banged to drive evil from your home.

May the World know that we are resisting the coup and fighting back peacefully.”

For 56 years, ACS has been supporting **Asian Missionaries who testify to the goodness of God's grace**. They have understood that what the Holy Spirit is leading you into, He has also been preparing you for. Even now, evangelists are traveling telling the Gospel story. Now is a time for us in the West to cooperatively pray continually for our brothers and sisters on the other side of the world. There are many far

from God who will be asking questions just like the youth at the funeral of a friend who died at the hands of the military police in this terrible situation.

While the crackdown against anti-coup protestors in the major ethnic-Burman and Buddhist cities of **Yangon (Rangoon)** and **Mandalay** is being widely reported by mainstream media, (*Check out YouTube for the most current reports*) the situation throughout the periphery – in Burma's ethnic minority states (where most of the country's Christians live) – remains, as ever, dark.

In **Karen State** (around 30 percent Christian) some 5000 Christians are currently displaced in the jungle because the Tatmadaw (Burmese Military) has destroyed at least 23 villages over the past two months. In a report published on 7 February, David Eubank, founder of the Free Burma Rangers, commented that the Karen feel that “their own lives haven't changed: they were attacked before the coup and they are being attacked now after the coup.”

This is a great opportunity for the Gospel as many, many Burmese people will be asking the eternal questions, “Who am I?” and “Why am I here?” and “Is there anything more?” Through our prayers our evangelists can providentially be in the right places at the right times to answer and guide them toward salvation and following Jesus forever no matter what happens.

March 26: The lives of our team members are on the line. Tragedy is unfolding in Myanmar. We can pray for their protection and provision through this darkness in their land. Please Pray!

The People of Myanmar (At least 93% of 52,000,000 are far from God – primarily Buddhist and Animist.) Pray for peace to prevail and for reconciliation between the Military, the insurgent groups and the National League for Democracy group.

The people are experiencing...

- Food scarcity in the urban areas as everything is shut down
- Cash scarcity because work is shut down and the banks are closed
- Transportation problems as many urban areas are very restricted with many checkpoints
- A high risk of civil war

Please Pray...

- Pray that God will grant comfort to those who have lost loved ones in the violence.
 - Pray for the Christian Ministers who have pastoral responsibilities for the members of their congregations including those living in fear, those who are soldiers and protestors.
 - Pray that God will fill the ministers with His wisdom and His words during these difficult times. Ask God to remind them of *His* power and *His* omniscience.
 - Pray for the Internally Displaced Persons who are facing even more difficult times.
- Pray for the Christians to be light in the midst of the darkness so that those in the dark will see their good works and glorify our Father in Heaven.
 - Pray that the present civil upheaval in Myanmar will lead to something better. Pray for the safety of leaders who are detained and for the believers to be strong, calm, wise and careful.

The people in Myanmar have suffered so much – for so long. They certainly long deeply in their hearts for something better. Please rally everyone you can to pray. Our God can do miraculous things when we pray in unity. May His will be done on earth as it is in Heaven!

Besides Biblical training, it can be used for conducting various training programs or seminars, like CHE training, Leadership Seminars, Christian Women Seminars, Youth Seminars, and Children Teachers Seminars.

The Lisu evangelists are working hard to convert the Lisu ancestor worshipers. As God's grace is sufficient in every situation, the hard work of Robert and his wife paid off. Another 6 families of ancestor worshipers have come to Christ and now, Keng Tung House Church has 30 families of new converts. In the same way Peter and his wife Tabitha's hard work and dedication, another 10 families of ancestor worshipers have come to accept Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior and now, May Zele Church has 60 families of new converts. Moreover, in the second week of this month, a

Relief work in the Northern Most Part of Kachin State

1. Mulashdi Clinic — Simon

The Mulashdi Clinic was started twenty years ago and currently is the only medical facility in the whole North Burma area that is open. With everything closed because of the Coup, the clinic has seen an increase in clients and is now seeing about 100 per day. With supplies going fast, a pickup truckload of medicines were delivered after a 1000 mile journey through many military checkpoints in early March. This is another place where "Love in Action" provides a way to share the gospel. Simon sent a short message as the Internet was briefly available.

Dear Kent, I am safe in Putao, saving precious lives of our people. Keep praying for us as we are the only team who help medical care in Putao at this challenging time. Blessings. Simon

Simon established a “Well Drilling” Ministry Team a number of years ago. They have drilled or dug by hand several hundred wells in the last few years. They have worked in many villages and have often worked where there were no Christians yet. The recent movement of refugees from Rakhine State has established several new IDP camps in the surrounding areas of Yangon. This was reported in a previous UPDATE. Since our last report, the team has drilled several wells in those camps. This is “Love in Action.”

Because of this good aspect of “Good News,” the Gospel has had an opportunity to be shared and received. There have now been a number of new converts in the camps. Thank you to the **Youth Group of the Worthington Christian Church** in Columbus, Ohio for raising money for many years to fund “Living Water” well projects.

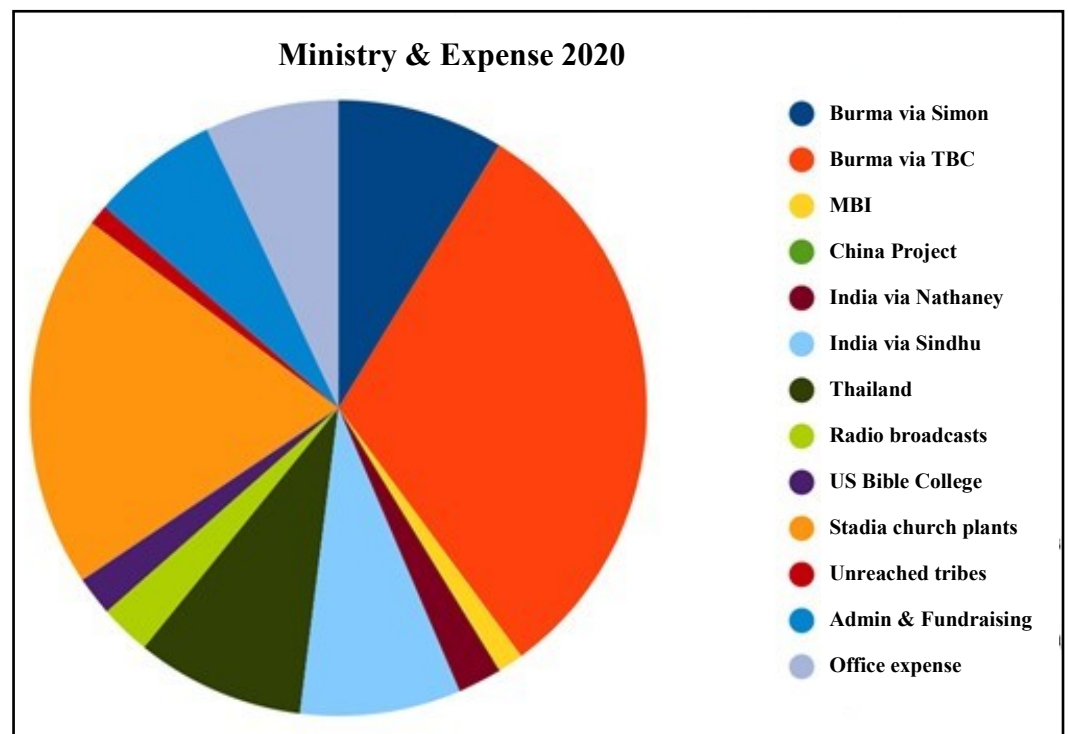
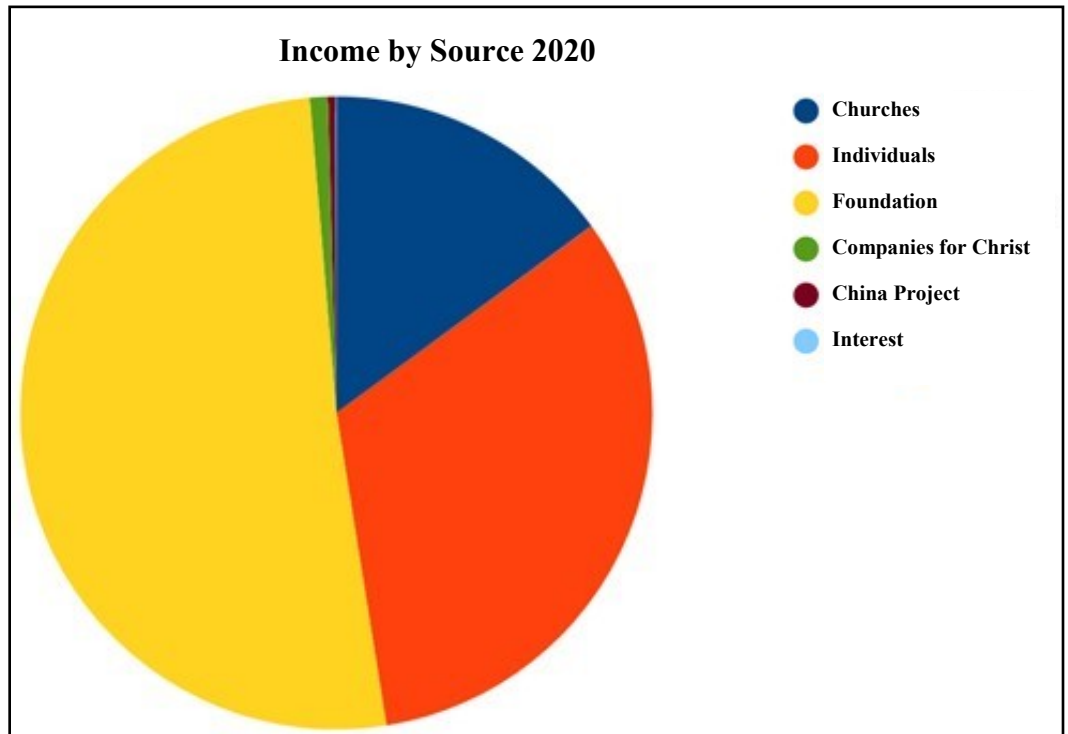

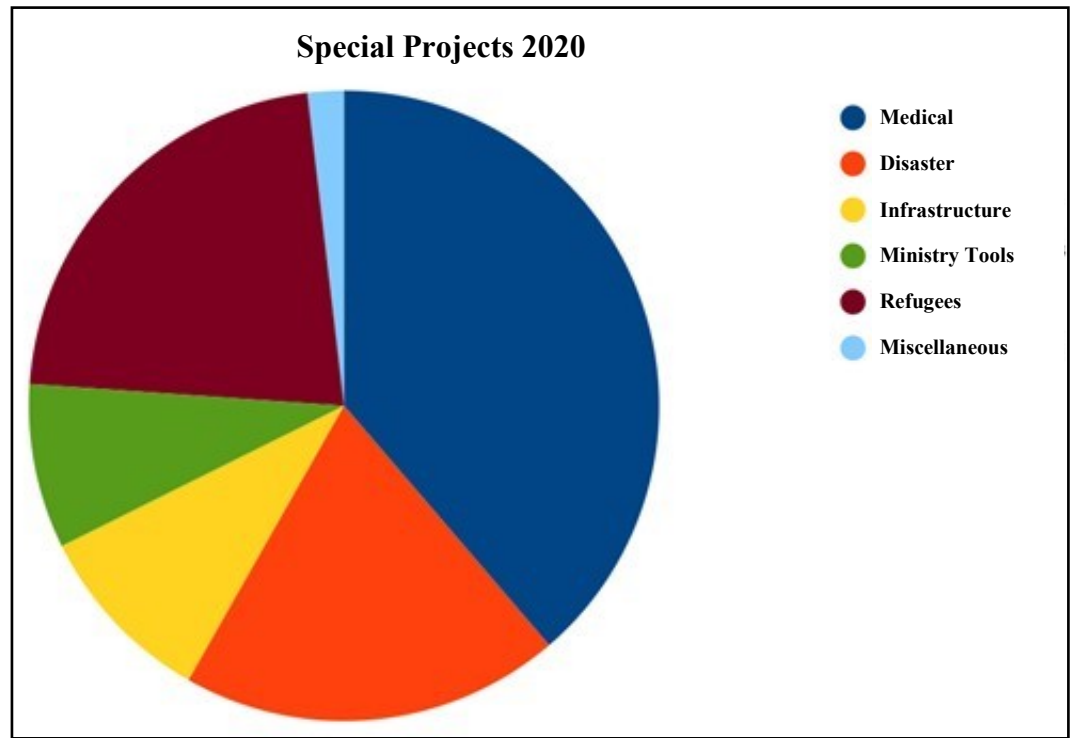
The pie charts that follow may help to better visualize the overall work of Asia Christian Services. The pie charts start at 12 o'clock and go counterclockwise in the order of the list in the legend.

Looking at the **Income Pie Chart**: in 2020 about 15% of income was from churches; about 33 directly from individual donors; almost 51% from other nonprofit missions such as IDES, Stadia, FAME, GBM, and LATM (see the Special Projects chart); less than 1% from private companies; about 0.4% for the China Project; and 0.01% from interest. Interest is a new income source for ACS as we have tried to be better stewards of donations for multi-year projects such as unreached tribe outreach (a new initiative in 2019 starting with the Ann and Tavoyan tribes, new church plants, etc., where we can invest a portion of funds held in reserve for the second or later years of the project; currently, these funds are invested with one of our partners, Church Development Fund, whose motto is "helping churches grow". We thank our Lord for all those who donate to ACS and pray for His blessing on them!

The **Ministry & Expense Pie Chart** shows the distribution of support ACS provided to various countries by way of the trusted colleagues in Asia who receive, distribute and oversee the funds sent: Simon Thaug in Burma (Myanmar), Manasseh and Aaron Fish and their colleagues at Taunggyi Bible College, Vern Bissell's China Project, far NE India via Nathaney and the LifeCare NGO, East India via Sindhu Pani, Thailand via Mark and Tasanee Songsiriphong, Radio Broadcasts by Gospel Broadcasting Mission, Education of Asian colleagues in US Bible Colleges, Church plants in Buddhist areas by Stadia and ACS, and ACS's new work among the Ann and Tavoyan unreached tribes mentioned above; our Administration and Office Expense costs are also included.



The **Pie Chart for Special Projects**: the one-time gifts in times of need that the evangelists in Asia use to relieve suffering and reach people at “teachable moments” with the Gospel—shows the variety of these projects, which amounted to about 47% of ACS’s expenditures in Asia. The top category in 2020 was Community Health Evangelism due to the additional task of providing medical supplies for Covid 19. Refugee Relief came in Second place for 2020 and Third place was Disaster Relief. The Fourth place was held by Infrastructure and Ministry Tools—categories which cover a variety of buildings, basic utilities, literature, vehicles, etc.—were other major categories.
