Church Planting Among Buddhists With STADIA . . . Kent Odor – ACS Board Chairman

2017 marks the beginning of a new resource partnership with STADIA to establish churches within wholly Buddhist communities. Through the years, Buddhist peoples have been most resistant to the gospel. Most of the 40 still "unreached tribes" in Burma are Buddhist tribes: unreached means... no one in that tribe has ever heard about Jesus! Through trial and error, the church planting evangelists have discovered that initiating a ministry first to the Buddhist children is a very effective bridge to reaching the family for Christ.

STADIA has agreed to partner with ACS and help secure funding for the building of 10 Preschool/Church buildings adequate to the taste of Buddhist communities. These will be strategically placed in their communities. A preschool for Buddhist children will function through the week and the new church will meet in the building on Sundays. In this partnership ACS has agreed to raise new support for both the new church planters and the preschool workers and the needed supplies for the first three years of each new work. ACS is drawing from a deep pool of already trained and effective workers to launch these new works. We are hoping that all the needed resources for each new plant will lead to a fully self-supporting church during this planned window of time. This is a faith experiment but our God is able to sufficiently grow each church as He sees fit.

Before you read this newsletter, I will have returned from Myanmar on a trip to dedicate the first Church/Preschool building and commission the first workers in this new partnership with STADIA. The accompanying photos show the progress of the construction from the ground dedication until it was 80% finished at the time of this printing. It will be finished when I arrive for the dedication on October 7. In this newsletter we will introduce the new Grace Village team. At this moment, there are 17 in the core of the new church. Most of them are new believers from this community. The preschool has enrolled 20 children who are meeting in a facility next to the new building. This is the beginning.

Gratefully, already three months of seed money has been given to ACS to begin this team's full time mission work in Myawaddy, Myanmar. It will last through December 2017. At this printing we are still praying for full funding or, a commitment to fund monthly the full three years of support needed. We are trusting that the resources needed will arrive just in time. STADIA has informed us with joy that sponsors for Church plant #2 has come forward and #3 is pending. The funds for Church #2 will be provided to ACS by the end of December. This will another new church in another new community!

The Asian workers for those both new sites have been called and they and their families have already moved into those new communities. They are establishing house-churches in their homes. They are providing for their family's needs through "tent-making". They will not be able to work full time on this new plant until we can provide their support but they will proceed as they can until then. We need new support for those teams also to continue to progress forward with this fantastic opportunity for the gospel. We will introduce them on our website and in future newsletters.

Please spread the word through your church connections and among your friends about the needs in these new church plants. Rarely is there a mission donation opportunity that bears so much lasting fruit for eternity for such a reasonable contribution. These church plants provide maximum mission stewardship. As 2017 winds down, year-end contributions can be made to these projects to fully fund them for full three years and ACS will responsibly collect, store and distribute the funds monthly to them over that time.

Because, "The Lord is...not willing that any should perish, but that all should come to repentance. (2 Peter 3:9 KJV)," ACS will continue to pioneer bringing the Gospel into new tribes. This project will reach a new tribe and provides another layer of strategy to ever increasing missional toolbox. Thank you for your continual prayer and your love for those on the other side of the world!

I was born in a village called Pang Khaing , in 1981 and was the youngest son of my family. I was raised in a Christian family. My parents were animist before they became Christians. My parents heard the gospel from the Morse family, missionaries from USA, and the whole family converted. At the age of five, I went to school near my village. My dad passed away when I was seven. When I was 14, I put my faith in Jesus and was baptized.

My passion is sharing the gospel to all the ethnic groups of Myanmar. In 2000, my mom and I moved to the city where my brother was serving the Lord. In my life,

that was the turning point. One year later after we moved, I went to a Bible School and got my Diploma degree after a three year study. I became involved in the ministry as a youth pastor in one of the churches in Yangon. Later on, we moved to Kayin state and I planted a church.

In 2007, I got married, but we don't have any biological children yet. But, God gave us a responsibility to take care of my niece and nephew who are orphaned, and one adopted girl. They are so lovely. By the Grace of God, now I have a wonderful family.

I have been serving the Lord in the music ministry as a worship leader and also an associate pastor at Myawaddy church in Kayin State. I have recorded over 20 songs

My name is Nwe Ni Oo. I was a strong Buddhist and the youngest daughter, favorite one, of my family. They wanted me to listen to

them at all times and to follow the decisions that they made for my life. My family wasn't poor and they had a good reputation in town.

When I was 12, I

began to feel a strong headache and had an optical problem. I couldn't see things well so that I had to wear glasses. When I felt a headache, I thought myself about to die. From the age of twelve, I was frightened by death and thinking about where I will be if I would die today. I tried to follow the instructions of Buddha as much as I could, but my fear didn't go away. Those instructions made my life more heavier.

When I was 24 I met with two Christian wom-

en ministers who lived in the city next to my city. They shared with me about Jesus and the message of Salvation. That was the first time I ever heard about JESUS. Since then faith was rising in my heart. They often called me and encouraged me on the phone. One day, My family found out that I was about to become a Christian. They beat me up and announced that I am no longer their family member. They totally abandoned me. The next morning at 4 A.M, I left my family and got out barefooted from the house. All I have is JESUS who can lead me to Life. It was the most painful moment of my life and also an exciting moment of my future with My Lord Jesus as well. Praise God!

The women who led me to Christ accepted me to live with them. They loved me as their sister and taught me the word of God. I started attending the same church together with them and got involved in the youth group in the church. On 15 May, 2015, I got baptized. God healed my eyes and I had no more optical problem, I had no need to wear the glasses. As I prayed, He healed me.

I have now become a Sunday school teacher and I am volunteering as a pre-school teacher

at Grace village in order to share the good news. I have finished a teacher training program from the government. I am blessed to be part of the body of Christ and have brothers and sisters in Christ.
