MERCY FOR MYANMAR

*“Trust in Him at all times, O people; pour out your heart before Him;
God is a refuge for us.” Psalm 62:8*

It seems like there is nowhere to hide from Myanmar's growing storm of violence. The military seems determined to keep power and has stepped up aggression against the civilian population. Kidnapping people from their homes in the dead of night and taking them off the streets is common, and no one feels safe. The current result of the Military Coup is that the country has erupted into a civil war. The innocent hilltribe people have been caught in the middle of the fighting and are in the path of the general lawlessness of the military leaders. Random killing and bombing is now the norm. The devastation of the innocent is overwhelming.

Military soldiers are burning homes and markets, randomly shooting into homes that are occupied and giving airstrikes that level whole villages. The villagers are escaping, leaving everything behind, including their animals to find shelter in the jungle. Military bombings and fighting between ethnic armed groups have destroyed many homes, driving thousands of families into hiding in Kayin, Chin, and Shan states.

The people are desperately needing food, shelter, medicines, and good water. They also need loving care to deal with the trauma they are feeling and the

hopelessness of the situation. Many preachers and church leaders are rising to meet some of those emotional and spiritual needs.

Continue to lift up the churches in this difficult time. The churches across Myanmar are themselves interceding on behalf of the nation. They have stepped up their giving. For each pot of rice that many cook, they give a fist of uncooked rice to the church elders to share with the poor and needy. It is estimated that in the next six months over 4 million people will be in severe hunger. The Christians have found that nonbelievers are open for prayer. A simple, "Can I pray for you?" is often

answered, "Yes!" Pray that the people of Myanmar would pour out their hearts to God and find refuge in Him.

Our prayers and financial resources are needed to assist the displaced, starting with basic food and shelter relief.

ACS is partnering with IDES (International Disaster Emergency Services) in a great relief project to provide food, shelter and medicines in four devastated areas of Myanmar. He told me that his village is on the top of a mountain and there is no stream for giving baptism. So, they made a plastic water pond and gave baptism.

The playground is up and running and is a delight for the refugee children. ...The playground came out of the partnership between Asia Christian Services (ACS) and STADIA. ACS was established to support the work of indigenous church leaders to take the Gospel to the peoples of SE Asia. STADIA is a church planting organization in the US that has been called to plant churches in the US and has over the last few years expanded to plant churches in many places around the world. They work with donor churches and individuals that fund the planting of churches with a specific focus on the urgency of reaching, protecting and in some cases rescuing children for Jesus.

This specific project at Immanuel in Mae Sot was the result of a generous church in New Mexico who after a visiting the work among the refugees in the MaeSot in 2019 felt led to help rescue children, plant churches, and share the Gospel. They had worked with Kids Around the World before, so it was a perfect fit given the school and the church building. They funded the building of the playground.

I know Tutu (The school overseer) and Salai Htay (the church planter) are thrilled and of course, I am sure the kids are super excited that the playground is up. Again, we are so thankful that you were able to make this happen for us after such a long wait. We really appreciate it!

Mobile Medical Mission Trip from Putao to the Hidden Valley April 23-25

Dear friends, Greetings from Myanmar. We all are doing well and safe under military coup. It has been challenging time for us under political unrest and fighting.

But we never give up to serve our Living God. I took my family and fellow friends to Putao, northernmost part of Myanmar where Morse family used to travel over 70 days to pass Himalayan Mountain ranges in 1921, a century ago.

We drove three days to reach to Putao from Yangon with Medical supplies. We stayed Mulashidi where Morse family set up mission base after escaping from Communist China. We set up Mulashidi Clinic by the help of FAME and IDES. It saved many lives in two decades.

This time, we drove by motorbikes to reach the most extreme villages under the foot of Himalayan Mountain, near the Hidden Valley where Morse family lived 7 years in the jungle. There are many leeches and blood sucker insects. We took this adventure trip for the Lord before monsoon comes. We cannot drive muddy roads in rainy season.

We arrived in Ziyadam village, the last village in the northwest and started giving medical care and dental extraction. Our team learned this dental extraction from **mPower** by the help of **IDES**. This becomes a great beneficial for those villagers where there is no dentist and doctor.

The villagers went to the Mula stream and fished 20 pounds for

us. Some went to hunt for food for guests. Some brought smoked jungle rats for VIP guests. It is awesome to see their generosity and love even though they are very poor.

We gave medical treatment and dental care to 250 villagers and drove another village, called Ahwadam. We continued giving medical and dental care to 130 patients and drove back Putao home.

We healed their traumas, physical, mental, and spiritual sickness. God is faithful and protect us all the dangerous

roads, passing 7 checkpoints and safely got back home to Yangon after 45 days mission trip. God is faithful to feed us even we did not take food with us.

Let's continue to serve our Living God even we are facing many challenges in this world. Our team invite you all to come and join next adventurous MISSION TRIP. Thank you for your prayer support and partnership to expand God's Kingdom in Asia.
